
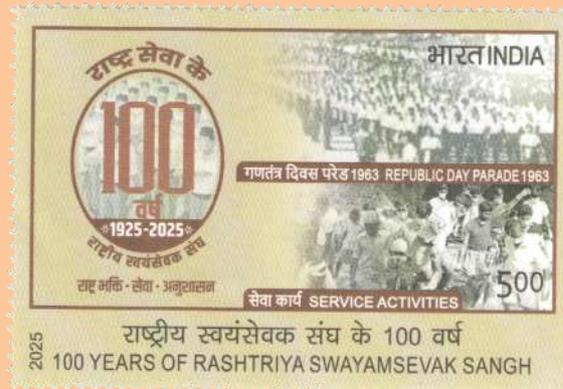

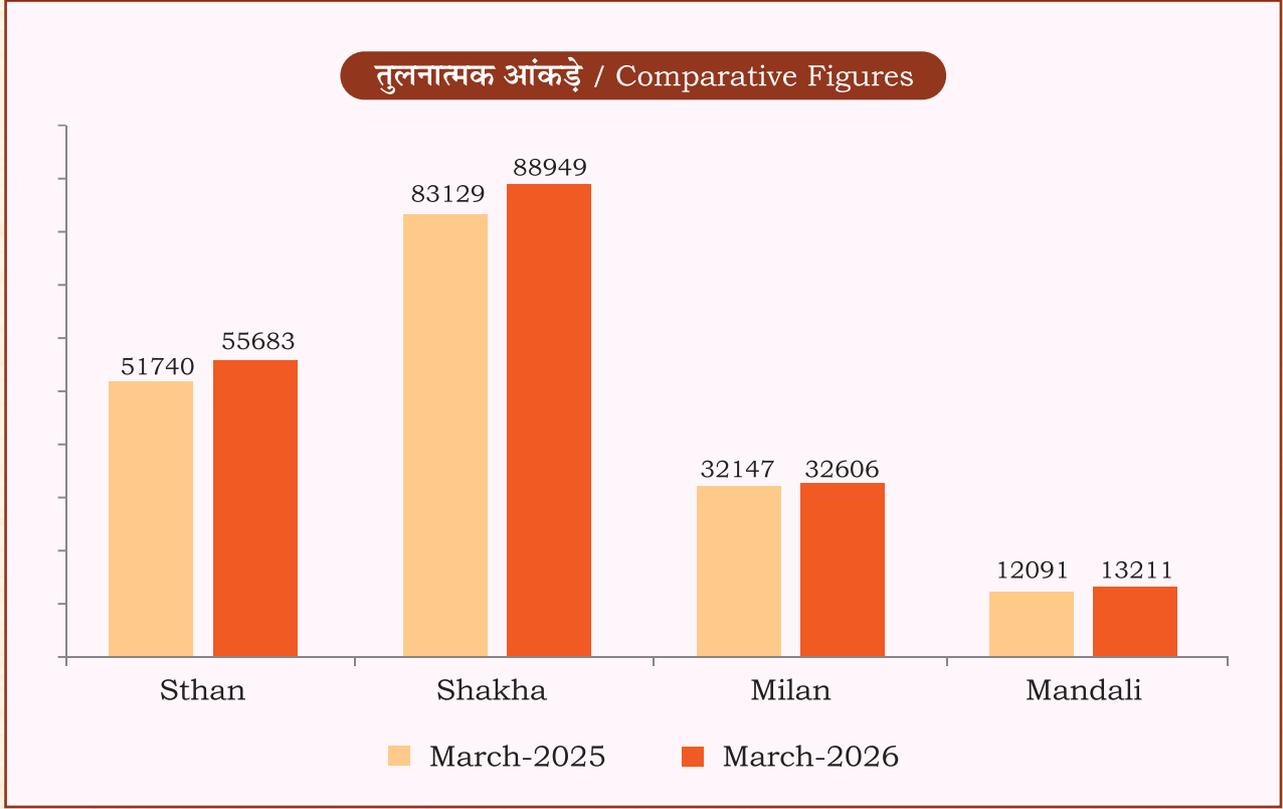

## Introduction

Param Pujaniya Sarsanghchalak ji, all the Mananeey Adhikaris and members of the Akhil Bharatiya Karyakari Mandal present here, Man. Kshetra and Prant Sanghchalaks, Karyavahs, Pracharaks, and all the Karyakartas of the Kshetra and Prant Karyakari mandals, all the Members of the Pratinidhi Sabha, and all the invited brothers and sisters working in various fields of organisational and social life,

I am delighted to extend a heartfelt welcome to all of you to the Akhil Bharatiya Pratinidhi Sabha meeting of Yugabda 5127 (2026 AD), being held in the spacious premises of this Gram Vikas evam Sewa Sadhana Kendra in Samalkha, Haryana. After successfully completing numerous programs of the Sangh Centenary Year, we have gathered again in Samalkha after three years. I hope that all will actively participate in the deliberations of this meeting, which will continue for three days from today, and make it a success. I am confident that we will clearly outline the follow-up work for the coming year here, and that the meeting will provide us all with sufficient energy and direction.

It is with great pleasure that I present before this Pratinidhi Sabha the brief report on the activities undertaken by the Sangh across the country during the past year (2025-26). Following the last ABPS, Sangh Shiksha Varg and Karyakarta Vikas Varg were held in all provinces. Following this, preparations for the centenary year began, along with the expansion of work.

On the auspicious occasion of Vijayadashami, marking the completion of the Sangh's centenary, the centenary year programs

commenced with large number of utsavas across the country. The various programs of Shatabdi were universally successful, owing to the extensive planning and hard work of the workers. The society welcomed them gladly and with wholehearted support. At the invitation of the Sangh, brothers and sisters from various sections and segments of society enthusiastically participated and contributed immensely to the effective conduction of the programs.

Organising programs at a decentralised level was beneficial for the organization and a significant success in reaching even the smallest segments of society. House-to-house contact allowed the Sangh to reach every household, while Sadbhav Baithaks and Prominent Citizens' Meets fostered positive thinking and a sense of duty within society. Understanding the Sangh's journey and work, everyone is expecting more from the Sangh in national life. The topics of the Panch Pariwartan are universally welcomed. Curiosity about the Sangh and its social work is growing. Meanwhile, many people have written books about the Sangh, staged plays, and made films. The Government of Bharat has also issued commemorative coins and postage stamps. I express my gratitude to all for their goodwill and appreciation for the Sangh.

Along with the centenary year programs, routine activities are also going on regularly. A brief account of all of these is presented in this report. A detailed account of all the programs is impossible in a limited report; hence, presenting a condensed version here.



Before we begin the formal proceedings of the Pratinidhi Sabha, we have a duty to perform. In the recent past, many brothers and sisters who were workers of our organisations have unfortunately passed away. We pay our heartfelt tributes to them and also to the memory of prominent individuals who did remarkable work in various fields of society and whose life journey of life ended due to various reasons, and we pray for the Sadgati of those departed souls.

## Tour of Param Pujaniya Sarsanghachalak

- Since the year 2025–26 marks the centenary year, the tour plans were made keeping the centenary programs in mind. Tour was held in a total of 22 Prants. Programs such as Samajik Sadbhav meetings, prominent citizens' meets, Hindu Sammelan, interactions with distinguished and influential members of society were organized in all provinces. In some Prants, interactive sessions were also arranged with young entrepreneurs, research scholars and prominent members of the Janjati communities. The purpose of all these programs was to present before everyone the 100-year journey of the organization, answer their queries, and invite them to participate. Including centenary and other programs, tours were conducted in a total of 37 Prants.
- In the four major Mahanagars of the country—Delhi, Bengaluru, Kolkata, and Mumbai—a lecture series was organized on the theme '100 Years of the Sangh – New Horizons.' At all places, eminent members of society were invited. Responding to queries and clearly explaining the role of the Sangh was an important focus. In Delhi, Bengaluru, and Mumbai, representatives from some foreign countries were also present. Informal interactions were held with them over tea as well. In total, representatives from 50 countries-active in intellectual, administrative, entrepreneurial, and social fields-participated. In Nagpur and Karnavati, dialogues were organized with foreign dignitaries.
- Under the 'Griha Sampark Abhiyan', met with Respected President of Bharat, Smt. Droupadi Murmu; Also met several other distinguished individuals of various fields such as art, culture, spiritual, education, science, trade and industry. During these meetings, discussions and conversations were held regarding Sangh work and social issues.
- Visits were made to Hindu Sammelan in Andaman, in Sonpairi (Raipur), and in Gangapur village of Devgiri Prant.
- Addressed the Swayamsevak gatherings in Pathankot and Ambala in February.
- There was also the good fortune of holding discussions with and receiving blessings from revered spiritual personalities: Shri Muni Mahashraman Ji Shri Muni Ratnasundersuri Ji; in Puri, Pujya Shankaracharya Nischalananda Saraswati Shri Shri Ravi Shankar of the Art of Living Foundation, Shri Daaji Patel Ji of Shri Ram Chandra Mission; the renowned Kathakar Pujya Shri Rameshbhai Ojha Ji; Guru Shri Vishwadevanand Saraswati Ji; and Babaji of Radha Swami Satsang Beas.
- On 23rd July in Delhi, was present at the concluding session of the Akhil Bharatiya Convention of the Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh. Addressed at the study camp organized by Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas from 25 to 28th July, in Kaladi, Kerala. Many Vice-Chancellors of universities and heads of various educational institutions from across the country had participated.
- On 5th December in Samalkha, inaugurated the three-day meeting of the Itihas Sankalan Samiti. On 26th December in Tirupati, spoke at the inaugural session of the 'Bharatiya Vigyan Sammelan' organized by Vijnana Bharati. On 12-13 October in Bengaluru, participated to speak and interact at the Akhil Bharatiya Mahila Samanvay Baithak. On 6 November 2025, addressed small entrepreneurs at the 'India Manufacturing Show'.
- The Vishwa Sangh Shivir, which is held once every five years, was organized from 25 to 29 December 2025 at Kanha Shanti Vanam in Bhagyanagar. Stayed there for three days—27, 28, and 29 December. Interacted with the Shivirarthis, answered their queries, delivered an address at the Samarop function and spoke before Shivirarthis at the Dikshant session.
- On 12th September in Nagpur, visited the Brahmakumari's premises and addressed the foundation day function. On 27th September, released the 'Prarthana' audio recording

rendered by well known singer Shri Shankar Mahadevan, and on 28 September, released an album of Sangh songs sung by him. On 22 December in Chandrapur, inaugurated the Tata Cancer Hospital. In October, in Mahakoshal Prant, had Darshan of Maihar Mata Ji; in Satna, met Purushottam Ji Maharaj Ji and inaugurated a Gurudwara, and guided the meeting of 370 Vistaraks who had set out for the centenary year. In Paschim Maharashtra, visited the Kaivalyadhama institution located in the Yoga and naturopathy center at Lonavala and interacted with Karyakartas. On 10 January, attended the Sudama Kuti function in Vrindavan. On 22 January, visited Chhoti Khatu in Chittor Prant during the Terapanth Maryada Mahotsav and addressed the gathering. On 5 March, in Saurashtra Prant, had darshan at the Vadtal Swaminarayan Mandir and, at Jaitalpur, attended the bicentenary celebration of the Swaminarayan Mandir, held discussions with prominent Saints and addressed the gathering. On 10 February, visited Namokar Tirth near Nashik, participated in the temple inauguration, attended the function, and held discussions with Swami Devanandi Maharaj Ji. On 4 February, in Malwa Prant at Khargone (Lepa), visited the 'Narmadalay' project of the 'Nimar Education Sanstha' started by Paravrajika Pujya Vishuddhanand Ji (Shrimati Bharti Tai Thakur). Also attended various Socio-

spiritual programmes including Udyog Vardhini - Solapur; Anuvrat Vyakhyanmala - Delhi; Goswami Prabhupada Sammelan - Bhubaneswar; Pujya Raghavacharya Ji Varsh Shraddha programme at Raivasa; Geetarth Ganga - Mumbai; Bhagwat Katha inauguration at Mandvi (Nana Ratadiya); Rotary Club - Nagpur; programmes of the Veterinary University at Sambhajinagar and Nagpur; on 12 December 2025, participated in the unveiling of Veer Savarkar Ji's statue in Andaman; inauguration of a garden; and the 'Sagara Pran Talmalala' programme organised in memory of Veer Savarkar, by the Valuable Group. Also attended several programmes of inauguration of buildings and book releases, and met former servicemen and administrative officers as well.

- On 25 November, Sarsanghchalak ji was present at the flag-hoisting ceremony held at the Shri Ram Mandir in Ayodhya. The flag hoisting was performed by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji and Pujya Sarsanghchalak Ji.
- On 15 August 2025, at the office of Utkal Vipanna Sahayata Samiti in Bhubaneswar, addressed a gathering on the Independence Day after hoisting the national flag. Similarly, on 26 January 2026, at Madhukar Niketan in Muzaffarpur, hoisted the national flag and addressed the gathering on the occasion of Republic Day.

## Tour of Mananiya Sarkaryawah ji

- As part of the plan for the year 2025-26, tours were completed in 31 Prants across all Kshetras (visits to three more Prants will be undertaken this month after the ABPS, making it 34.)
- As per the Prant's need, 2-3 day visits were planned for the Sangh Centenary Year's events and organizational programs. In addition, 5 more Prant were visited for various other programs.
- Participated in programs such as Samajik Sadbhav (Social Harmony) Meetings, Prominent citizens' meets, Hindu Sammelanas and outreach for distinguished Individuals/Groups, interactions with selected sections of the society.
- These programs witnessed enthusiastic participation from across the society. Invitees freely expressed their thoughts, suggestions, and expectations regarding social and national issues. The experience everywhere was a widespread welcome and support for the Sangh's work and role in national life.
- In addition to the above, attended Karyakarta meetings, experiences sharing of house-to-house contact campaign, Swayamsevaks' gatherings, and Pracharak Baithaks, among others.
- On October 2nd, Vijayadashami day, attended the Utsav and route march of Swayamsevaks of Ram Lalla and Ashok Singhal Nagars in Ayodhya Mahanagar. Informal discussion and personal meetings were also held with prominent sants of Ayodhya.
- Samajik Sadbhav Meetings - At the Sadbhav meetings, held in Patna, Agra, Bhubaneswar, Kanpur, Udaipur, Ranchi, Jamshedpur, Haldwani (Uttarakhand Prant), Agartala and Sambalpur (Paschim Orissa Prant), discussed social leadership's role in the current situation, the topic of Panch Parivartan, and other key tasks to be addressed; The participants, sharing their notable works, made some suggestions. Need to regularly conduct such meetings in the future was emphasised.
- Janjati Work - Meetings of ST social leaders and youth leaders were held in Indore (Malwa Prant) and in Jabalpur (Mahakaushal), where sessions were planned to discuss issues concerning janjati areas, ongoing positive work, suggestions, and Q&A.
- Prominent Citizens' Meets - Citizens' meetings were held at 23 places across 15 provinces, where topics such as Sangh@100, national scenario, Hindutva, Challenges before Hindu society, Panch pariwartan etc. were presented and questions were answered.
- Shreni meetings - Interactions and panel meetings were held with various sections of society (Shreni) in the provinces. These included:
  - In Ghaziabad and Noida cities of Meerut Prant, dialogue programs were held with diverse groups including industrialists, chartered accountants, spiritual leaders, former administrative, judicial, and military officers, and heads of hospitals and higher education institutions.
  - In Surat city of Gujarat Prant, interactions were held with professors, prominent members of the Buddhist community, prominent Scheduled Caste members, heads of NGOs, and young entrepreneurs.
  - In Karnataka Uttar Prant, two interactive programs were held with professors from various universities and colleges in the state, as well as 850 heads of educational institutions.
  - In Kanpur and Jodhpur, programs of women were held, where the role and the importance of women in the current context were discussed and their questions were answered.
- Griha Sampark (Home Contact) - Participated in the house-to-house contact campaign in Kanpur, Surat, and Indore Mahanagar.
- Hindu Sammelan - Addressed 10 Hindu Sammelans (5 Mandals, 5 Bastis) across 8 Prants.
- Yuva Program - A Shareerik Pradarshan by the Tarun Vidyarthi shreni of Indore, Malwa Prant, and college youth Ekatrikaran (gatherings) in Bathinda (Punjab), and Udhampur town, Jammu and Kashmir Prant, were held.

## Tour of Mananiya Sarkaryawah ji

- Interactions with young entrepreneurs were planned at various places, mainly in Bathinda, Surat, Muzaffarpur, Kashi, and Prayagraj.
- One Mahavidyalay Vidyarthi (college student) shakha each in Udaipur, Gorakhpur, and Jabalpur Mahanagars had the highest attendance on the day of visit.
- On November 26th, the Sapta Sindhu Forum held a youth dialogue program at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Bathinda, where interactions were held with talented young people who have achieved significantly in various fields of social life.
- On January 24-25, lecture programs were held for college students in Kashi and Prayagraj University campuses.
- On February 10, attended the Prerana (Youth Dialogue) program held in Kozhikode, Uttar Kerala Prant. Youth working in various fields were present at the program.
- On February 24-25, addressed the 'Blooming India' (Youth Dialogue) program held in Thiruvananthapuram and Ernakulam Mahanagars of South Kerala Prant, in which researchers and professors of various disciplines from colleges and universities took part.

### Other notable events

- Following this year's Sangh Shiksha Varg, in the new year, attended two meetings in Mumbai and Guwahati to discuss the situation in janjati areas, and a meeting in Chandigarh regarding the situation in Punjab.
- Participated in the Acharya Sushil Muni Birth Centenary Celebrations in Delhi, on June 15, where the 14th President of Bharat, Shri Ram Nath Kovind, was the chief guest.
- Addressed the seminar organised by Hindustan Samachar on June 26, in Delhi on the 50th anniversary of the Emergency.

- Participated in a meeting of Heads of various Hindu spiritual organizations in Coimbatore, on January 27-28, where major issues concerning the Hindu society in Bharat and the world were discussed.

# Shatabdi Varsh Programs

## Introduction

On the completion of one hundred years of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh's dedicated national service, it was decided to organise various programs to mark the centenary. The Sangh did not intend to celebrate its centenary, but planned to engage in extensive social outreach, national and social awakening activities on this occasion. On the one hand, efforts were made to expand the organisation and enhance its quality. On the other hand, efforts were made to address the five dimensions of social change, coordinate and organise the power of good, and promote narratives on Bharat and Hindutva.

With this end in view, various programs were outlined for the centenary year. The programs, their format, and their purpose were as follows:

### **The year's programs began with the Sangh Foundation Day Vijayadashami Utsav.**

**Form** : Programs and route marches at the Mandal and Basti levels, with maximum number of Swayamsevaks in Ganvesh.

**Objective** : Expansion of work, activism of all Swayamsevaks, and the Sangh's reach.

### **Extensive Griha Sampark (house-to-house contact ) and Village Contact**

**Form** : To conduct as many village and household contacts as possible in the provinces through a period of 3-4 weeks, by small groups of Swayamsevaks.

**Objective** : To introduce the Sangh's 100-year journey and its work, to convey the role of citizens in the current situation, and the issues of five-dimensional changes.

### **Samajik Sadbhav (Social Harmony) Baithaks**

**Form** : Meeting of selected social leaders and saints belonging to various sects, communities of the entire society at the block/city level; brainstorming.

**Objective** : Harmony and mutual cooperation among social and religious leadership, resolving deficiencies, practicing collective thinking and effort, and enhancing social power. Discussion on the implementation of five changes.

### **Prominent Citizens' Meet**

**Form** : A 2-4-hour brainstorming session of selected prominent individuals from various sections of society at the district level.

**Objective** : To awaken socio-cultural clarity and commitment and responsibility, through presentation, dialogue, and Q & A on topics such as Sangh work, Hindutva, one's role in the current national situation, five changes, etc.

### **Hindu Conference/ Congregation or Sammelan**

**Form** : A 3-4 hour gathering of Hindus at the Mandal and Basti levels (or their representatives). Organisers: A committee of local prominent individuals.

**Objective** : Cultural unity and organized strength of Hindu society, awakening of Hindutva/Dharma, and the practice of Panch Parivartan.

### **Yuva Program**

**Form** : Gathering of young students/youth at various levels as per local planning; youth meetings, interactions.

**Objective** : To enhance national consciousness, organizational mind set, and efforts for social change among the younger generation; to increase youth engagement.

With the above in mind, an unprecedentedly large number of programs were organised across the country. The enthusiasm and involvement of people from society were highly encouraging. As a result, an effective environment of national awakening, social churning, introduction to Sangh thoughts and work, and support was created on a wide scale. Here is a quick account of a few representative programs:

# Shatabdi Varsh Programs

## (Centenary Year Programmes)

### Vijayadashmi Utsav



Vijayadashmi Utsav was held on 2nd October 2025 (Ashwin Shukla Dashami) at Reshimbag grounds in Nagpur. The large number of Swayamsevaks, dignitaries and general public present, at the celebration were addressed by Pujaniya Sarsanghchalak ji. Former President of Bharat, Shri Ramnath Kovind ji, as the chief guest, addressed the gathering. The message of greetings sent by the Buddhist guru His Holiness the Dalai Lama on the centenary year of the Sangh was read out at the function.

**Karnataka Uttar** - Vijayadashmi Utsav and Path Sanchalan (Route March) were held at the Mandal and Basti level. Total 2545 programmes were organised at 1875 Mandals and 672 bastis in which 70,226 Swayamsevaks participated in full uniform. At 1280 locations, 308 Path Sanchalans took place in which 1,22,379 Swayamsevaks participated in uniform and 92,700 other citizens participated as viewers. At Hubali, an extensive plan was carried out to reach out the people through Gatnayaks (group leaders) in 23 categories, due to which there was a substantial increase of 5226 Swayamsevaks in the Path Sanchalan.

**Madhya Bharat** - On the occasion Vijayadashmi Utsav, in the Rajgarh Vibhag, Path Sanchalans were organised at 358 locations, covering 283 Mandals and 75 Bastis. 27,441 new uniforms were purchased by Swayamsevaks. 72,463 Swayamsevaks participated. The participation of all 6 Bastis of

Rajgarh City, representing 48 neighborhoods was ensured. In the Nagar with 32,113 population, 2,280 Swayamsevaks participated in the Sanchalan, while 1,480 men and 1,690 women watched the programme. In Bhopal Mahanagar, a professional category-wise Sanchalan was planned by identifying the main professions such as Doctors, Advocates, Professors, Teachers, Industrialists and young Entrepreneurs. Total 2,917 Swayamsevaks participated in the Sanchalan in which 475 professors, 414 doctors, 330 teachers, 305 advocates, 185 industrialists, and 180 youth entrepreneurs participated. At Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology (MANIT), the national institute at Bhopal, Path Sanchalan of students was organised in which 232 students and 24 professors participated. At Prant level, Path Sanchalans were organised at all 1814 Mandals and 759 bastis in which total 2,96,877 Swayamsevaks participated in complete

uniform.

**Jodhpur** - In the Prant special focus was given to completion of full uniform of the Swayamsevaks. At 1,990 locations, 2,14,692 Swayamsevaks participated in the Path Sanchalan, representing 5,128 locations of Mandals and Bastis. Total 1,05,005 uniforms were sold out in this effort. 85,846 were purchased by new Swayamsevaks. Among the total participants, 1,53,049 were youth and 47,047 were Bal (children) Swayamsevaks. 1,16,783 people came to watch, in which 38,106 were women and 78,677 were men. In Bikaner vibhag, all villages from 8 out of 13 Khand were represented by Swayamsevaks in full uniform.

**Himachal** - Vijayadashmi utsav was planned in the Prant at Khand and Nagar level. 1068 Mandals and 307 Bastis were represented in 204 Utsavs. 28,446 Tarun and Bal Swayamsevaks were present in full Ganavesh. The increase in Ganavesh is 170% compared to last year. 20,256 Tarun and 5,739 Bal were present at the Sanchalans held at 181 places.

**Braj** - Vijayadashmi Utsav were organised in the entire Prant between October 1-5, 2025. District wise speaker's workshop was organised in which 1957 Karyakartas participated. Different workshops were organised for Ekal

Geet (solo song), Gana Geet (group song), Amritvachan (sacred quotations), Prarthana and Parichay. 1,038 Karyakartas participated in Ekal Geet, 6709 in Gana Geet, 635 in Amritvachan and 560 in Prarthana respectively. 40,000 new uniforms were purchased by Swayamsevaks as part of the preparation. The Prachar team ensured that book exhibition and sale is organised at every Vijayadashmi Utsav. To ensure the active participation of women, sisters were involved in planning, execution and Gata Nayak (group leaders) level responsibilities. Total 2355 Utsavs were held in the prant in which 1,28,880 Swayamsevaks, 4020 Ghosh Vadaks (band troop) and 24,144 women and 74,825 men participated as viewers.

**Odisha Purva** - On the occasion of Vijayadashmi, 668 and 131 programmes were held at Mandal and Basti level respectively, while at the higher level (district/mahanagar) 131 Utsavs were organised. Representing 1005 Mandals and 405 Bastis, 28,641 Swayamsevaks participated in the full uniform. At 269 locations, 15,522 youth and 3,594 Bal Swayamsevaks participated. At 245 places, the route march was organised along with the band in which 2,707 Ghosh Vadaks participated. On this occasion, 18,000 new Swayamsevaks prepared their uniform.

**Madhya Bharat** - Entire Prant carried out the campaign to reach out to maximum households covering all localities and villages by forming local teams. 46, 493 teams, involving 3,09,107. Swayamsevaks reached out to 27,41,930 families in the Prant. Besides the campaign, a special plan was also prepared to reach out to the opinion makers in the society under which 3,478 were contacted.

**Braj** - The campaign was carried out in the entire Prant from 10 to 30 November 2025. Representation came from 178 blocks and 971 mandals. Youth from 2,114 villages and 388 bastis (localities) were present. 432 colleges and 228 hostels participated in the programmes. During the programmes, books worth Rs 2,55,000 were sold.

**Uttar Bang** – A Prant level Yuva Sammelan was organised. Youth between the age of 15 and 35 years were contacted and their acknowledgement forms were accepted and Identity cards were distributed at Khand Nagar level baithaks. Puja iya Saraanghachalak ji spoke at the Sammelan. 5,729 young boys & 1,053 girls participated.

**Dakshin Assam** – In the prominent presence of Mananiya Suresh Joshi Ji (Bhaiyyaji), invited member of the Akhil Bharatiya Karyakarini, Samajik Sadbhav Baithak were organised in Haflong, Hailakandi and Sribhumi towns. In Haflong, 72 prominent persons from 19 communities were present; in Hailakandi, 70 persons from 22 communities; and in Sribhumi, 80 persons from 21 communities participated.

## Shareerik Vibhag

- On 18 July 2025, the Akhil Bharatiya Shareerik team baithak was held in Beas village, Amritsar district of Punjab Prant. All the expected 27 Karyakartas were present.
- At the same place, on 19–20 July 2025, the Akhil Bharatiya Varshik Baithak was also held. Out of the expected 105 Karyakartas from 45 Prants (out of 46), 98 Karyakartas were present. Ma. Sarkaryavah ji and Sah Sarkaryavah Shri Ramdatt Chakradhar ji guided the participants.

## Seva Vibhag

### Training Programs and Meetings

- In the presence of the Vibhag Level Sangh team, joint planning meetings of the Seva Vibhag and Seva Institutions (including the Karyalaya Nyas) was held in 247 Vibhags.
- This year, training camps for Shakha Seva Karyakartas were conducted in 932 Nagars.

### Work Details

- In 15314 Vyavasayi Shakhas of 3007 cities, 26492 Seva Karyakartas have been appointed. In 12826 Bastis, Seva activities are being carried out according to the needs of the Basti with the cooperation of local Shakhas.

### Seva Details

- Across the country, a total of 96,045 Seva activities (daily or weekly) are being conducted, including those of all Matru Sansthas. These include 45,931 Educational, 15,632 Health, 17,888 Social activities. Apart from this 55,958 other Seva activities were conducted.
- The number of Shakhas conducting Seva initiatives is 15,680

## Sampark Vibhag

- For the review of the annual planning of the Sampark Vibhag and the programmes of the centenary year, a meeting of the Kshetra Sampark Pramukhs and the Akhil Bharatiya Sampark Toli was held in Delhi on 11–12 February 2026.
  - As part of Sangh centenary year, topics of Sangh thought and Panch Parivartan were conveyed to the enlightened members of society through Prabuddha Jan Sangoshtis organized at major locations across the country by the
  - Param Pujaniya Sarsanghchalak Ji answered questions on various topics and offered guidance.
  - At other locations as well, Prabuddha Jan Goshti was arranged and distinguished personalities from 10 different categories of society were invited and introduced to various dimensions of the Sangh, Hindutva, Rashtra, and the concept of Panch Parivartan. As a result, several entrepreneurs and others included the message of Panch Parivartan in their Diwali greeting cards.
  - In eight major cities, retired officers have formed separate groups for each of the five themes and have started public awareness initiatives in schools and colleges.
  - Pujaniya Sarsanghchalak ji and Mananiya Sarkaryavah ji had personal meetings with

- Sampark Vibhag conducted a special drive to establish contact with Ambassadors of various countries based in Delhi. All expressed positive views on the subjects of Panch Parivartan and Kutumb Prabodhan.
  - As part of the Sangh's centenary year, gatherings of young entrepreneurs, sportspersons, artists, ex-servicemen, research scholars, and others were organized at major locations across the country. Women also participated actively in these events.
  - In various Sadbhav Baithaks, prominent members of the Sikh, Buddhist, and SC/ST communities participated in significant numbers.
  - This year, members of the Akhil Bharatiya team also traveled to Union Territories and other smaller states/regions such as Kashmir Valley, Leh, Sikkim, Andaman and Nicobar, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Diu and Daman, Lakshadweep, Mizoram, Meghalaya, Nagaland, etc. Akhil Bharatiya Adhikaries also undertook province-wise tours and attended meetings in all regions.
  - Positive interactions took place with people from different faiths and traditions in the social, religious, political, and educational fields. Constructive responses were received even from individuals who are generally considered to be critics or opponents.
- Outreach was conducted with Archbishops, Cardinals, Chief Imams, Pujya Dalai Lama Ji, the international religious leader of the Parsi community Pujya Shri Khurshed Dastur Ji, Shri Samay Sagar Ji Maharaj, Shri Hazira Huzur National Saint Ishwar Shah, the Honorable President of India, and various officials from the government and defense sectors located in Delhi and other major cities of the country. Distinguished personalities from across the country who have received Padma and other awards were also contacted, and information about the Sangh centenary and Panch Parivartan was shared with them.
  - A grand and large program was held on the eve of the inauguration of the 162nd Maryada Mahotsav in Chhoti Khatu town of Nagaur district. In the holy presence of Acharya Maha Shraman Ji, Pujaniya Sarsanghchhalak Ji addressed the gathering.
  - Discussions were held with intellectuals on contemporary national issues. As a result, prominent personalities from across the country came together and issued 'Open Letters' on several important National subjects, which had a positive impact.

# Karya Vibhag Vrutta

## Prachar Vibhag

- Keeping in view the preparations for the centenary of the Sangh, the Prachar Vibhag planned training for workers and various related dimensions. In this context, programs such as dialogues with journalists, meetings with columnists, and gatherings of social media content creators and influencers were organized. A plan was also prepared for the media. Material was provided for publication across small and large media institutions regarding - the purpose of the Sangh's establishment, the major milestones in its hundred-year journey and the Sangh's views on key issues. Along with news reports, mediums such as interviews, accounts of projects, documentaries, and panel discussions were also utilized.
- On the occasion of the Sangh centenary this year, arrangements were made for wide dissemination through various media platforms (print, electronic, and social media) of a lecture series titled "100 Years of the Sangh's Journey – New Horizons" by the Pujanija Sarsanghchhalak Ji at four locations—Delhi, Bengaluru, Kolkata, and Mumbai. All four programs were broadcast live through various television channels and social media platforms (YouTube, Facebook, and X). Materials were sent to newspapers in all languages. Many articles were also published on the themes addressed in Sarsanghchhalak Ji's speeches.
- The programs marking the Sangh's centenary began on Vijayadashami, 2 October 2025. As every year, arrangements were made for the live broadcast of the Vijayadashami celebration from Nagpur. It generated the most discussion on social media. On X, the hashtag #RSS100Years saw a total of 3,50,812 tweets, with 23,200 people actively participating. Its total reach was 9 crore, and it remained in global trending for about 26 hours. In addition, #RSS1001 remained among the top three trends for 46 hours until 3 October 2026. On the occasion of Vijayadashami, newspapers and magazines in all languages across the country published articles and special issues on "100 years of the Sangh's journey." News channels also broadcast programs and produced podcasts. Many books on the Sangh's work, ideas, and achievements were also published by various publishers.
- This year, on 22 August 2025, an informal interaction program with editors and state heads was held in Kolkata with the Mananiya Sarkaryavah Ji. A total of 42 people were present.
- On the occasion of the Sangh centenary, a dialogue program 'Social Media Sangam' were held to help people know and understand the Sangh. 222 at such programs were held at district, Vibhag, and Prant levels between Sangh Adhikaries and content creators, and influencers. 12,492 participants attended these programs.
- With the objective of advancing intellectual discourse, literary festivals and book fairs are being organized continuously. This year, literary festivals were held in Indore, Katni, Kashi, Banswada (Chittor Prant), and Delhi.
- As Part of centenary year initiatives "Social Media Conclave" was organized on 21 September 2025 at Pathey Bhavan in Jaipur with the main objective of forming a dedicated team of skilled workers and content creators for the Prachar Vibhag at the Basti level. In the workshop, along with youth from the settlements, women from families were also included, and a total of 276 trainees received training. During the training, sessions were conducted on modern topics such as content creation, video management, article writing, and the effective use of Artificial Intelligence (AI).



## Organisational Programs

**Kerala Dakshin** - Balaramapuram Town Shakha celebrated its Shakha Varshikotsav on 25th January 2026. 320 Swayamsevaks were present, of whom 73 were in full Ganavesh. The Gat arrangement was systematized and the preparation of the Ghosh was strengthened. Earlier, the Shakha had only 6 Ghosh Vadaks. With 30 minutes of daily Ghosh practice after the Shakha, the number of Ghosh Vadaks has now increased to 73. A Sanchalan was also taken out. 136 Swayamsevaks participated in full Ganavesh. Including Matrishakti and well-wishers, the total attendance was 309.

**Karnataka Dakshin** - Kolar Vibhag's Bengaluru Gramantar District, planned to conduct a Sharirik-Pradhan programme. Each tehsil was assigned one Sharirik subject, which was regularly practiced. On 30 November, at the combined demonstration programme held in Doddaballapura, along with Yogasana, Samata, and other practical displays, Karyakartas also presented a demonstration of recitation of Sanghik Shlokas. 93 Swayamsevaks were present.

**Andhra Pradesh** - In Nandyal district of Karnool Vibhag, special focus was given to Sharirik initiatives to enhance the quality of Shakhas. The aim of this effort was to increase the presence of Swayamsevaks and new members in each Khand's Shakhas, improve their physical capacity, and raise the number of participants performing Dand daily. Under the Akhil Bharatiya Prahara Mahayagya, a target of 1 million Prahars was set. Karyakartas from 36 Shakhas and 14 Milans performed a total of 9,18,334 Prahars. One lakh Prahars were completed in 4 Shakhas. As a result of sustained efforts, regular attendance at Shakhas increased significantly, and the number of Shakhas grew from 36 to 56.

**Paschim Maharashtra** - In the Sinhgad region of Pune Mahanagar, a Subhashit competition was organized on 17 April 2025. For each Shakha in every age group of the region, 50 Subhashits were selected and provided for practice. In the competition, groups of at least five Swayamsevaks had to recite 3 Subhashits by heart and in chorus. One of the three Subhashits was mandatory to be in Sanskrit. 12 Shakhas

participated. In addition, 49 Manachitra Parichay programmes were conducted.

**Gujarat** - In Indrapuri Nagar of Vadodara Mahanagar, the Panchjanya Ghosh Kendra organized a quality Ghosh Vadan programme titled 'Swaravandan' in July 2025 to mark the centenary year of the Sangh. 46 Vadaks performed 30 compositions. 350 were spectators present. Daily classes were held for 30 sessions and 6 residential camps were conducted for practice. 68 Vadaks participated in the training classes. Out of them, the selected 46 Vadaks took part in the programme.

**Vidarbha** - 'Abhyuday' programme was organized on 8 February 2026 by Nagpur Mahanagar College Students' Department for college students of Nagpur, under the aegis of Engineering India and Lakshya Forum, on the theme 'Param Vaibhavam Netumet Swarashtram'. As part of pre-preparation, a Hackathon was organized on 1 February 2026 at the I.I.I.T. Nagpur campus, in which more than 650 students participated. On 8 February, 12 diverse competitions were conducted, with students from over 30 colleges participating. Discussion panels were held on topics such as Space Tech: The New War Frontier, Responsible AI: From Chaos to Consciousness, Can Ancient Indian Values Guide Modern Life. Exhibitions featured Sant Dnyaneshwar Maharaj, Shri Guru Teg Bahadur Ji (Hind Ki Chadar), Bhagwan Birsa Munda, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, among others. Through the contact of 450 Gatnayaks, more than 3,800 students from Nagpur and Vidarbha participated.

**Malwa** - In Ujjain Mahanagar, plans were made in every Basti to increase Bal Shakhas. Karyakartas were selected, and visits were made to newly started Shakhas, along with weekly training classes for the Karyakartas conducting the Shakha. 57 short-term Vistaraks were deployed for one month under the Vistaraks Yojana. By Vijayadashami 2025, Bal Shakhas were started in all 65 bastis. To ensure that the Shakhas ran regularly and systematically, weekly training sessions, weekly Shakha team meetings, and monthly meetings of Shakha Palaks were organized in all towns. To make Shakha teams more capable, the 'Shakha Toli

Sangam' was planned. It was held on 24–25 January 2026, and was attended by 235 Karyakartas from 65 Shakha Tolis representing all 65 Bastis. The programme included collective Sharirik activities. Parents of Bal Swayamsevaks were also present.

**Madhya Bharat** – Special efforts were initiated for work expansion in multi-storied buildings/campuses in Bhopal and Gwalior Mahanagar. An annual work plan was prepared. In Bhopal, there are 36 Shakha-yukt, 18 Milan-yukt, and 85 activity-yukt campuses. In the programme conducted with Ma. Sah-Sarkaryavah Shri Mukund Ji, 211 Karyakarta Bandhu-Bahini from 51 campuses participated. In Gwalior, there are 19 Shakha-yukt, 13 Milan-yukt, and 47 activity-yukt campuses. In the dialogue programme conducted with Ma. Sah-Sarkaryavah Ramdatt Ji, 204 Karyakarta Bandhu-Bahini from 37 identified campuses attended. Through campus work, 78 Bal Gokulams, 9 Adhyayan Kendras, and 13 monthly Kutumb Milan programmes are also being conducted.

**Mahakaushal** – In all 21 units of Jabalpur Vibhag, Bal work was expanded through Bal Sanchalans organized on 25 December 2025 on the occasion of Veer Bal Diwas. In 77 schools, contact was made, meetings were held with children living in the families of responsible Karyakartas and their neighborhoods, and across all towns, gatherings, sports festivals, Van Sanchar, and Chandan programmes were conducted. During Ganavesh Vikray Saptah, 483 new Ganavesh were created. A total of 2,099 participants took part in the 21 Sanchalans. At all Sanchalan locations, exhibitions of the four Sahibs were displayed.

**Chittaud** – In Ajaymeru Vibhag, 'Swar Shatabdi' Ghosh Shivir was organized at Azad Maidan from 24–26 January 2026 on the occasion of the 77th Republic Day in Ajaymeru Mahanagar. The main objective of the Shivir was to achieve qualitative improvement in the skills of Ghosh Vadaks and to awaken self-awareness in them. The curriculum, eligibility, and other details were finalized, and an intensive two-month preparation was undertaken. In the short span of just one and a half days, 60 Vadaks rigorously practiced 12 hours of Sanchalan, Vadya Samata, and various

formations (Pratibhram, Chandrakar, Baan), and on the evening of 26 January, during the programme, they performed uninterrupted recitation of 30 different compositions for 45 minutes. CRPF Deputy Commander Shri Rajendra Ji was present as the chief guest. About 500 citizens, including 20 eminent musicians of the Vibhag, attended the programme. Prior to the Shivir, on 21 January, to mark the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, 30 Ghosh Vadaks of the Sangh performed a Jugalbandi along with the CRPF and Rajasthan Police bands.

**Chittaud** – In Bara Nagar, to enhance the quality of Swayamsevaks, a 'Bal Shakha Karya Sangam' was organized on 21 December 2025. Shakha Palaks were assigned, and 26 preparatory meetings were held, with special focus on the continuity of Shakha teams and ideal arrangements within Shakha. Various Sharirik and Baudhik competitions were conducted to improve quality, and based on the scores obtained, 'Uttam' and 'Ati Uttam' Shakhas were selected and honored. 503 Swayamsevaks from all 18 Shakhas of the town attended the Sangam.

**Jodhpur** – Special efforts for the increase and qualitative development of Ghosh Vadaks in the Prant continued throughout the year. Currently, there are 241 Ghosh Kendras. District-wise Ghosh camps were organized from 15–17 August 2025. 2,263 Vadaks received training. 1,500 new Vadaks learnt Ghosh. In 1,563 Path Sanchalans conducted during Vijayadashami 2025, 7,526 Ghosh Vadaks participated. Under the seven-day part-time Vistarak scheme, 263 Ghosh Vistarak went to 144 centers. Ghosh classes in all 21 districts of the Prant were completed in January 2026, with participation of 1,017 Ghosh Vadaks.

**Haryana** – In Hisar and Bhiwani Vibhag, with a view to expanding and strengthening Vidyarthi Karya, a meeting of Karyakartas upto Shakha Mukhya Shikshaks was held in Bhiwani Nagar. Completing stages such as Shakha expansion, Shakha team formation, regularization of Shakha team meetings, and Shakha inspections, 230 participants from 103 Shakhas – including Mukhya Shikshaks, Shakha Karyavah, and Karyakartas with higher responsibility – attended. All Shakhas brought

their Shakha Registers, which were reviewed by Mananiya Sarkaryavah Ji. He Sarkaryavah also Answered to the queries asked by the Karyakartas.

**Jammu & Kashmir** - Vidyarthi Karya Vibhag arranged an Ekatrikaran of Swayamsevaks between the age of 16 and 35 years in Kathua Nagar. On 29th January 2026. 278 Swayamsevaks attended. 155 Swayamsevaks attended an Ekatrikaran on 30th January in Jammu Mahanagar. Sah Sarkaryawah Dr. Krishna Gopal Ji spoke on topic such as United society and character development, Bhartiya tradition of democratic values and family system.

**Braj** – In Harigarh Mahanagar, to strengthen Shakha Tolis, the Mahanagar Sangathan Shreni Karyakartas planned a ‘Shakha Toli Sammelan’ to foster the development of Shakha teams and improve quality in the Shakhas. In the first phase of the plan, eight points were emphasized for Mukhya Shikshaks and Karyavahs, including performing 13 Surya Namaskar with mantras, memorizing 100 games, reciting prayers, and studying the biography of Pujya Doctorji. In the second phase, at the Bhag level Sammelan, physical exercises were emphasized upon, and at the Shakha level, survey of Shakha area, house to house contact system, organizing Varshikotsavs, and increasing attendance at Shakha were focused on. The Sammelan was attended by 597 Karyakartas from 210 Shakhas.

**Avadh** – In Lucknow Vibhag, Karyakartas entrusted with responsibility of Sangh Karya in Large Apartments and complexes established special contacts in large and important apartments, and collected information about the social structure of families residing in it. Karyakarta teams have been formed, and regular weekly Milans are being conducted. Year-round programmes such as Bharat Mata Poojan, Dev-Darshan, Holi Milan, Yoga Day, and various Seva activities have been planned. A list of 817 apartments has been compiled, of which 315 have been contacted. In 42 apartments, Kanya Poojan was conducted; in 5, Sangh Parichay classes; in 29, Sah-Bhoj; and in 93, International Yoga Day programmes were conducted. Currently, 19 Shakhas and 17 weekly Milans are ongoing, while regular meetings are held in 61

apartments, Sundar Kand recitations in 52, and Hanuman Chalisa readings in 55 apartments.

**Avadh** – Karyakartas of Bal Karya Vibhag of Purvi Lucknow, arranged major programmes such as Bal Shivir, Matki Phod, and Bal Path Sanchalan. Bal Shivirs were planned in 14 towns, of which 5 towns successfully conducted the Shivir. 240 Swayamsevaks from 29 Shakhas participated. The Shivirs included Sharirik, Baudhik, and cultural sessions, along with various competitions in night sessions. The Matki Phod programme was conducted in all 14 towns. 460 Swayamsevaks participated. In the Bal Path Sanchalan, 275 Swayamsevaks took part from all 14 towns.

**Jharkhand** – The Guru Govind Singh Vidyarthi Shakha of Ranchi Mahanagar, enthusiastically conducted its Varshikotsav on 14 January 2026. Special focus was given to Sharirik subjects along with Ghosh practice. The Shakha team discussed in meetings the group-wise contacts, home visits to each Swayamsevak, and all matters related to the schedule and arrangements for the Varshikotsav. During the Varshikotsav, demonstrations of Niyuddh, Dand, and Ghosh were conducted, and a Path Sanchalan was also taken out. 140 Swayamsevaks attended. 10 new Ghosh Vadaks were trained.

**Odisha Paschim** – Lulukidihi Shakha of Balishankara Khand, organized a 12-hour Akhand Surya Namaskar Yagya on 30 December 2025. At 6:30 AM, 104 Swayamsevaks assembled, and after Havan, Hanuman Chalisa recitation, and hoisting the Dwaj on a 31-foot-high pole, 26 groups of 4 participants each were formed. Each group performed Surya Namaskar for 15 minutes before the next group began. A total of 14,594 Surya Namaskars were completed. Spectators included 179 Swayamsevaks from 5 Khands, 1 town, 16 Panchayats, 6 Bastis, and 30 villages and 250 men and 600 women making a total of 1,029 spectators. At the conclusion, Bharat Mata Aarti was performed, Havan was concluded with Purnahuti, followed by Baudhik, Sangh Prarthan, and Dhvajavatan.

## Society-oriented Programmes

**Dakshin Tamil Nadu** - A meeting was convened at the Kasi Viswanatha Temple in Tenkasi district, in collaboration with local residents, voluntary organisations, and government employees, to make the Mahabhishek more environment-friendly. In this meeting, it was resolved to prohibit single-use polythene, to place waste bins along the Rath routes, and to distribute cloth bags.

**Andhra Pradesh** - The Venkata Krupa Vyavasayi Shakha of Tirupati town undertook a special initiative on environmental conservation in a Basti. During September, 25 Swayamsevaks met every week for 10 minutes to discuss topics such as water conservation, saving electricity, and making “eco-bricks” from plastic waste, and they shared the changes they had implemented in their own homes. Subsequently, the Swayamsevaks formed five groups and, in November, contacted 500 households, conducting a campaign to promote a plastic ban and encourage the use of steel. A positive atmosphere in favour of environmental protection was thus created in the Basti. In January, 200 steel plates, glasses, and bowls were collected, and sets of 25–25 items were made to establish a “steel bank” in the homes of eight Swayamsevak.

**Konkan** - Karyakartas associated with Paryavaran Sanrakshan organised a “Harit Samvad Sangoshthi” in Mumbai on 31 January 2026 under the joint auspices of My Green Society and the National Stock Exchange, with the objective of taking the green concept to the masses. Around 190 representatives from about 90 social institutions, including corporate companies, educational institutions, voluntary organisations, and housing societies, participated in this programme.

**Pashchim Maharashtra** - A “Cloth Bags” campaign was conducted in the province on 26 January. Programmes such as distributing pamphlets and putting up exhibitions were organised to increase the use of such bags. In 16 districts, a total of 112 diverse programmes were conducted, with the participation of 13,918 people. Exhibitions were held at 93 locations, and 5,019 pamphlets were distributed. At 17

locations, old saris were collected and converted into cloth bags, and 4,800 bags were distributed.

**Pashchim Maharashtra** - In the Sinhgad area of Pune Metropolitan region, an environment-friendly Ashadhi Ekadashi programme was organised on Ashadh Shukla Ekadashi, dated 6 July 2025, under the “Polythene-free Temple Area Campaign”. In the ancient Shri Kshetra Vitthalwadi temple premises, continuous efforts have been underway for the past three years to promote the use of paper bags so that the problem of polythene and thermocol waste does not arise on Ashadhi Ekadashi. A plan was prepared through the coordination of the temple trust, Pune Municipal Corporation, the police department, and Swayamsevaks. With the cooperation of various schools, social organisations, and citizens, more than 11,000 paper bags were prepared and distributed. On the day of Ekadashi, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., Swayamsevaks distributed free paper bags to flower vendors and devotees.

**Gujarat** - The city of Vapi has a total of 35 Seva Bastis. On Seva-Divas, especially Thursdays, Swayamsevaks of the Vyavasayi Shakha regularly maintain contact in these Seva Bastis. Activities undertaken include Bal Sanskar Kendras, Hanuman Chalisa Kendras with sanitation workers, efforts for de-addiction, Patangotsav on Makar Sankranti, Guru-poojan on Guru Purnima, Bharat Mata poojan on 15 August and 26th January, community meals on auspicious days, and Aarti of Matarani during Durga Puja. As a result, two girls from the Sanskar Kendra secured positions at the state level in drawing and kho-kho competitions.

**Saurashtra** - The Chhatrapati Shivaji Vyavasayi Shakha constructed a “Madhuvan Plantation” in Khambla village of Manavadar taluka, Junagadh district, with the cooperation of local citizens. Citizens provided financial support amounting to 15 lakh. On 10 January 2024, after the Bhoomi Poojan, 6,500 saplings of 132 indigenous Bharatiya varieties were planted across 30 Bighas of land. Arrangements such as a borewell, electricity, and drip irrigation have been made in the plantation. Inspired by this

project, tree-planting activities have commenced in nine other villages. The committee is also promoting initiatives like distributing bicycles, e-bikes, and solar energy.

**Saurashtra** – On the occasion of Pujaniya Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Jayanti on 13 April 2025, Rajkot Mahanagar and Gondal district organised 170 free medical camps. In these camps, 337 doctors, with the assistance of 785 Swayamsevaks, treated 9,000 patients.

**Malwa** - 1) The Shivaji Vyavasayik Shakha of Salaknpur village in Nalchha block, Dhar district, conducts numerous socially beneficial initiatives across 15 tribal villages. So far, they have distributed 7,850 pairs of slippers, 7,600 caps for children in winter, 700 sweaters and inners, and 750 blankets. Efforts include providing study materials to tribal children, rehabilitating malnourished children, distributing packets of vegetables and nutritious food, conducting tests for sickle cell anaemia patients and their families along with supplying necessary medicines. In the village, the cremation ground has been cleaned, trees planted with wire fencing around them, and cemented benches installed for seating.

2) Swayamsevaks of the Anandeshwar Bal Shakha in Kukshi ran a campaign against the use of Chinese manja.

3) The Adinath Vyavasayi Shakha of Ujjain Mahanagar distributed cloth bags to about 1,500 families in a basti with the aim of environmental protection and creating a plastic-free locality.

**Madhya Bharat** - Numerous Shakhas in the Prant undertake socially useful initiatives. In Seegpura Mandal of Lahar district, a de-addiction campaign was launched. Gram Sabhas were organised in each village. So far, 80 people have quit addiction. Madanpura village has become alcohol-free. Swayamsevaks of the Keshav Shakha in Shivpuri town initiated a plastic (disposable)-free Shakha area campaign a year ago. A utensils bank was started. The Madhav Shakha of Jawar block in Sehore district has constructed a night shelter for cattle. The village is adjacent to the highway, where cows

used to rest at night and often met with accidents, resulting in injuries or death. To directly connect society to the cattle rest house, an “one house, one roti” initiative is run, where people from the neighbourhood bring rotis from their homes.

**Mahakaushal Prant** - In Balaghat district of the Prant, the message of environmental conservation was disseminated during the “Shriram Balaji Gram Mangal Yatra”. This year, it reached over one lakh people across 210 villages in 11 routes. More than fifty per cent participation was by women. In addition to environment-themed floats, stalls showcasing earthen pots, organic products, and cow-based items were also set up.

**Chhattisgarh** – The Sewa Vibhag of Raigad Vibhag, formulated a plan to make all Sewa Bastis of the town service-oriented. To implement this, tours by Jagran Shreni Karyakartas were ensured, and workshops were organised for appointing and training Sewa Karyakartas in Shakhas. Training covered Bal Sanskar Kendra, Samajik Sanskar Kendra, Kishori Vikas, Legal consultation Kendra, health centres, and self-reliance centres. On 1 February 2026, on the occasion of Sant Ravidas Jayanti, formal inauguration of service activities took place in all 22 Sewa Bastis of the division. 22 Sewa initiatives were launched, including 5 Bal Sanskar Kendras, 4 Samajik Sanskar Kendras, 2 Kishori Vikas Kendras, 1 Legal consultation Kendra, 6 health centres, and 4 Swavalamban Kendras (self-reliance centres).

**Jaipur** – Jhunjhunu District Jaisinghwas village in Jhunjhunu district, was plagued by mutual discord and numerous social evils. Through the efforts of Swayamsevaks, a Gram Vikas Samiti was formed in the village in 2021. The committee constructed a grand temple, which has now become the centre for collective festivals (Holi, sports, Satsang) and other social programmes. Evils such as addiction, DJ music, and public gambling are now completely banned, and security arrangements including CCTV cameras and street lights have been

installed across the village. Large-scale tree planting has been undertaken, and a “utensils bank” established to keep the village plastic-free. A Gau-shala has been built. Sixty farmers now practise organic farming and are training others in neighbouring villages. Installation of solar energy devices on every house is underway.

**Jaipur** - In the Prant, lemon saplings were distributed in large numbers. A total of 52,000 lemon saplings were distributed and planted in 400 villages. Two saplings were given to each household upon payment of 25 Rs. Women took the lead in nurturing the saplings. The survival rate of the saplings has been exceptionally high. This has now become a sustainable source of income as well

**Jodhpur** – Merta District In Merta district, efforts were undertaken to clean the Derani Talab, which had turned into a dumping yard. Around the pond, 4,000 medicinal and fruit-bearing trees of 25 varieties, as well as five dense mini-forests, have been planted. By contacting local residents, a team of 50 women and 152 Men was formed, and weekly Shramdaan along with weekly Harit Milan was started. This pond has now become the cleanest and a polythene-free pond in the district.

**Haryana** - In Baslambi village of Bhaudakala block, Manesar district, Gopal Shakha Swayamsevaks began with small steps such as filling plastic waste into bottles and reducing its use in their own homes. They then took this issue to the wider society, which led to a visible improvement in village cleanliness and the environment. The panchayat, together with shopkeepers, enforced a plastic ban in the village. Five thousand cloth bags were distributed to households. Similarly, in Narnaund town of Hansi district, a meeting on environmental issues was held in November 2025 with Halwais ( Sweet Makers) , tent-house owners, traders, councillors, and social organisations, where consensus was reached to stop single-use plastic in functions. Consequently, plastic use has reduced considerably in major events in the town. At the Bhandara on Devotthan Ekadashi, paper and cardboard plates were used this time instead of plastic plates.

**Jammu & Kashmir** – The Nagni Shakha in Dessa valley of Doda district made concerted efforts towards de-addiction. This valley is affected by terrorist incidents and is a difficult terrain. A Shakha was started in the village. Along with students, key and enlightened members of social life gradually became associated with it. The trend of increasing intoxication and non-vegetarian food at weddings was a growing concern. Karyakartas began awareness efforts and dialogue in society on this issue. Whenever a marriage was scheduled in any family, these Karyakartas would speak with the family members, urging them to keep the wedding free from intoxicants. These efforts have started bearing fruit, and the financial burden on ordinary families has also reduced. So far, the Karyakartas have successfully helped conduct 25 wedding ceremonies free from intoxicants.

**Braj** - The Shri Ram Shakha of Kavarai village in Karhal block, after studying its Shakha Kshetra, learnt that many trees had been felled due to the construction of the Yamuna Expressway near the village. The Swayamsevaks prepared a plan and resolved to undertake large-scale tree plantation along the expressway. Together with villagers, they collected and purchased neem seeds (nibori). Along both sides of the expressway, seeds were sown using indigenous manure, and the saplings that sprouted from this Beejaropan were carefully nurtured. At present, 20,000 Neem trees have been raised, which is the highest number of plantations undertaken by any single village in that region.

**Kanpur** - In Rath town of Hamirpur district, the Natraj Praudh Vyavasayi Shakha has 250 Swayamsevaks on its rolls. The Shakha regularly conducts socially beneficial activities. Under the Dah Sanskar Sewa initiative, Swayamsevaks manage three freezer Shav Petikas, a water cooler for drinking water, prior stocking of wood and Kande (cow-dung cakes) for cremation, and provide wood and Kande free of cost to poor and destitute families, while also ensuring regular cleanliness of the Shamshan

Sthal. In the Basti, an education centre is run for children from deprived and economically weaker families, along with efforts to awaken Sanskar, discipline, and a sense of national feeling.

**Dakshin Bang** - In Kolkata Mahanagar, an “Paryavaran Pathshala” was organised on 29 January 2026 at Kolkata Blind School, Behala. A dialogue was held on nature and our responsibilities. In all sessions, oral interaction based on touch, smell, and sound was prioritised, which made learning easy and engaging. The “Waste Segregation Game” and “Interactive Quiz” were the main attractions. Partially visually impaired students assisted their completely visually impaired peers. Students were introduced to compost, bio-enzymes, and eco-bricks. At the conclusion, pencils made from recycled paper were distributed to all. 89 students attended.

**Madhya Bang** - For the past three years, 13 Shishu Sanskar Kendras and 1 Pathdan Kendra

have been running in Sarenga and Raipur blocks of South Bankura district. Women selflessly conduct initiatives for early education and value inculcation of infants in their respective villages. The annual festival was organised on 4 February 2026. Village children presented songs, Aasan, games, dances, and a dance performance to mark the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram. Eighty-two parents and 37 guests participated in the programme.

**Uttar Bang** - In Cooch Behar district, efforts were made to develop biodiversity along the banks of the Torsa, Kaljani, and Mansai rivers. To make the riverbanks polythene-free and to create a green forest belt, 13,500 local trees and five dense mini-forests were planted, and the tradition of Vriksha poojan was started to foster emotional bonding with the environment in people’s minds. A “Tree Ambulance” system was set up to ensure care and maintenance of the trees.

**Saurashtra** - Karyakartas of Kutch Vibhag organised a Gau-seva Sangam on 16, 17, and 18 June 2025. Invitations were extended through three Gau-seva Rathis to 318 villages. Guidance was provided on six key topics during the Seva Sangam. Individuals working across 18 dimensions of Gau-seva were honoured. The event also featured Nandi Poojan and Gau Yajna. 12,000 attended. 380 Karyakartas were engaged.

**Madhya Bharat** - The Kutumb Prabodhan programme at Shri Vidyasagar Prabandhakiya Sansthan, Vidya Praman Gurukulam in Awadhपुरी Bhopal was successfully conducted in the benign presence of Bhavanayog Pravartak Munishri Praman Sagar ji Maharaj. 1,530 family members of 680 Karyakartas from the Mahanagar participated. Munishri ji elaborated in detail on the subject of Panch Parivartan (Five-Fold Transformations).

**Chhattisgarh** - On 5–6 July 2025, 118 participants organised a two-day “Prakriti

Vandana Cycle Yatra” covering 80 km in Dhamtari, carrying placards displaying verses from Puranas and environment-supportive messages. During this period, 115 saplings were planted, and 1,010 seed balls along with 2,610 seeds were distributed. Contact was made with 2,227 people, who pledged to shun single use plastic, use cloth bags, and adopt a green lifestyle.

**Jodhpur** - To accelerate Gram Vikas work, 1,247 villages were selected, out of which committees have already been formed in 663 villages. In the province at present there are 302 Kiran Grams, 33 Uday Grams, and 9 Prabhat Grams. To promote organic farming, training camps were held in 48 villages of Sriganganagar, with the participation of 2,100 farmers. As a result, the inclination of 1,350 farmers towards organic farming increased, and 300 farmers have already started practising organic agriculture.

## Special Programmes of the Prants

**Kerala Dakshin** - on the occasion of National Youth Day on 12th January 2026, Sanghiks at Mandal level were organised for youth between the age of 15 and 40 years. Physical activities and games along with lectures and singing of Vande Mataram together were conducted in every Sanghik. 339 such Sanghiks were held in 99 Khands. Total 6,171 participated of which 3,159 were students and 2,976 were Vyavasayi Swayamsevaks. 216 were first timers. 3,471 additional people participated in Vande Mataram singing.

**Kerala Dakshin** - On 11 January 2026, the Kochi Mahanagar organised a programme in memory of the Veerahuti (Martyrdom) of freedom fighter Chempil Arayan, on the occasion of National Youth Day. On 13 January 1809, he sacrificed his life for the freedom of Bharat while fighting against the British Army. The objective of this programme was to introduce the forgotten historical warrior to the younger generation and to commemorate the 285th anniversary of his Veerahuti. A total of 314 youths participated. On this occasion, a Jal-Shobhayatra was organized. Several boats were tied together to prepare a raft. On it, 46 Swayamsevaks performed Ghosh Vadan. A demonstration of Kalaripayattu was presented, and Vande Mataram was sung collectively.

**Karnataka Dakshin** - In the Prant, the 'Navonmesh' programme for the age group of 18 to 25 years was conducted at 48 places between 16 to 23 November. In this programme, youths were given information about Sangh, and discussions were held on the topic 'What can we do'. Through 17 types of activities such as Deepotsav, Kabaddi competition, and Bike rally, contact was established with the youths. The Join R.S.S. campaign was conducted at 13 places, and 2,815 Nukkad Baithaks were held. During the programme, an exhibition on the greatness of Bharat was organised. At many places, videos on Queen Abbakka were shown. Programmes such as a signature campaign in the mother tongue and quiz contests were also conducted. 8,799 students and 3,973 Young Entrepreneurs participated in these programmes.

**Telangana** - On the occasion of the 350th martyrdom year of Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, an inspiring programme was organised in Bhagyanagar (Hyderabad) on 14th December 2025. The radiant life and sacrifice saga of the 9th Sikh Guru, Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, was presented. In the programme, the President of All Gurdwara Committee Telangana, Gurucharan Singh Bagga Ji was present as the chief guest. On this occasion more than 2,000 people participated, including many distinguished personalities. An inspiring exhibition on the sacrifice stories of Sikh martyrs was organised at the venue. A spirited Khadga (Sword) demonstration was also presented, and the programme concluded with the arrangement of Langar.

**Telangana** - In the Prant, the 'Gau Vigyan Pariksha' was organised on a large scale. This competition was conducted at the Gram/Basti level, District level, and finally at the State level. In the final state-level round, the winners were awarded cash prizes of Rs.1,00,000, 50,000, 25,000, and 10,000, and all participants were given certificates. For the examination, 5 lakh books were printed, out of which 4,80,000 were distributed for 10 each across many places including 1,255 villages of 35 districts, 1,580 schools, 110 colleges, 2 universities, as well as Bhajan Mandalis, Ganesh Mandaps, and Mahila Swayam Sahayata Samuhs (Women Self-Help Groups). 4,11,890 people appeared for the examination in person at 1,942 centres. The final stage of the examination was organised in Bhagyanagar (Hyderabad), in which 2,248 selected participants took part from across the State. In the grand concluding ceremony more than 4,000 women, men, and children were present. As chief guests, Union Minister Shri G. Kishan Reddy and Shri Bandi Sanjay Kumar presented the awards to the winners.

**Paschim Maharashtra** - On 2nd January 1940, Pujaniya Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Ji had visited the Bhavani Sayam Shakha of Karad. To commemorate this occasion, 'Bandhuta Parishad' was organised this year in 12 districts of the Prant. 2,736 participated.

## Special Programmes of the Prants

**Devgiri** - On the occasion of the 350th martyrdom year of 'Hind Di Chadar' Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, a widespread Jansampark Abhiyan was carried out, through which outreach was made to 6,761 villages and 1,130 Bastis of towns and cities. A total of 4,381 Karyakartas contributed actively, and Rath Yatra was organised in 890 Bastis and 4,461 villages, establishing contact with 52 different sections of society. For the promotion of the programme, a short film was shown in 246 schools, and 37 full-time Karyakartas remained engaged in this work.

**Devgiri** - Keeping in view the social conditions of the Prant and the ideological conflict prevailing among the Janjatiya and Bhatke -Vimukt Samaj, special 'Chetana Parishads' were organised at the district-level. In these meetings, 1,693 distinguished persons from 11 different communities participated, including doctors, lawyers, and teachers from the Janjatiya Samaj, and had the opportunity to hear the experiences of Padmashri Shri Chaitram Ji Pawar. In the same sequence, 'Bhatke Vimukt Chetana Parishad' was organised for 230 representatives from 38 communities of Beed, Latur, and Dharashiv districts, in which Mananiya Bhayyaji Joshi provided guidance. The main objective of these events was to remove ideological confusion while preserving the traditions and customs of the society.

**Malwa** - In the presence of Mananiya Sarkaryavah Ji, a special programme was organised in the Prant on 29 November 2025 for the social and religious leadership of the major Janjatis residing in the region - such as Bhil, Bhilala, Patelia, Barela, Gond, Korku, Saheriya, Vega, Bhairia, and Uraon. In the programme, information was given about the social, religious, cultural, health, education, and self-reliance projects and activities being carried out in Janjati areas by Sangh and various organisations. Leaders from all districts presented details of the special work being carried out in their respective areas along with their experiences. The situation of Jhabua district was discussed in particular. Mananiya Sarkaryavah Ji presented a detailed introduction

of the organisational and social activities being carried out across the country and shared information about the Seva Karyas being undertaken by Swayamsevaks.

**Madhya Bharat** - A three-day 'Matribhasha Samaroh' was organised in Bhopal. Along with the presentation of various cultural programmes, theatrical performances were presented on Bhagwan Birsa Munda, Vande Mataram, and Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, along with a musical presentation on the occasion of Sangh Shatabdi Varsh. On the concluding occasion, guidance was received from Akhil Bharatiya Karyakarini Sadasya Shri Suresh Soni Ji. The theme of the programme was Panch Parivartan. It also included Sangh Vikas Yatra exhibition, signature campaign in Matribhasha, Sankalp Patra, and other activities. In the programme, 8,000 students participated in various competitions. In total, more than 1 lakh persons participated in the event.

**Madhya Bharat** - On the occasion of Sangh Shatabdi Varsh and the 150th year of the Vande Mataram song, 'Swar Shatakam' programme was organised in Gwalior. About 600 participants from 30 teams of 18 schools and 12 colleges of the Mahanagar took part in the Samuhgaan Competition. Six winning teams presented their performances in the programme. On this occasion, an instrumental orchestra by young artists and an attractive Bharatanatyam presentation based on Vande Mataram were also presented. The programme was attended by 1,680 distinguished persons. Guidance was received from Sah-Sarkaryavah Shri Ramdatt Chakradhar Ji.

**Jaipur** - The Mahavidyalayin Karya Toli of Malaviya Bhag started a monthly research scholars' dialogue programme named 'Batlavan' in August 2025. Its objective is to connect research scholars with the idea of Bharatiyata, and to ensure that research is Bharat-centric and that the idea of 'Swa' is reflected in teaching and study. It is organised at Rajasthan University, MNIT Jaipur, and Central Sanskrit University Jaipur. Every month, selected students prepare research papers on a topic

given by the Batlavan Team Out of these, 3–4 selected research papers are presented, followed by a dialogue on the subject, after which the Toli collectively prepares a research paper. Research teams have been formed in all three universities. 143 research scholars are associated with this initiative.

**Jaipur** - A 38-member Aayojan Samiti, formed for work among teachers and students of Vishwavidyalayas, organised the programme 'Bharat Bodh'. A four-day programme was held at Rajasthan University. Activities such as a discussion on 'Paramparagat Bharatiya Khelon Mein Bharat Bodh' and a poster competition on the theme 'Bharatiya Parivar' were conducted. At the conclusion, there was a lecture on the topic 'Rashtriya Ekatmakta Ke Sutra'. 387 students participated.

**Delhi** - In the month of April, the Prant's Pradhyapak Karya Team (which also includes heads of academic institutions holding Sangh responsibilities) initiated a process of contacting the heads of various educational institutions in Delhi. More than 60 Vice-Chancellors, Directors, Principals, and Registrars were contacted. They were presented with the book 'Bhavishya Ka Bharat' In October–November 2025, under the Pradhyapak Karya Aayam, 24 intellectual and ideological seminars were organised in various colleges. 833 Professors participated.

**Delhi** - On the occasion of Sangh Shatabdi, the Prant's Ghosh Vibhag organised the 'Shriramarchanam' programme at Ayodhya Dham on 21–22 February 2026. The programme began with Saryu Vandan. From there, proceeding in Sanchalan, Sthir Vaadan was performed at Lata Mangeshkar Chowk, and tributes were offered to the Balidani Karsevaks. Performing Sthir Vaadan at various locations, the participants completed Pradakshina in the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Mandir Corridor, followed by Sthir Ghosh Vaadan and Sangh Prarthana. Vishwa Hindu Parishad Vice-President Shri Champat Rai Ji provided information about the Temple construction, and blessings were received from Pujya Govind Dev Giri Ji Maharaj. 108 Vadaks, aged between 13 and 65 years, performed 39 compositions 108

times and offered 108 Malas to Shri Ram Lalla.

**Haryana** - On the occasion of the completion of 150 years of the composition of the 'Vande Mataram' song, the Bauddhik Vibhag of Haryana Prant organised a Shakha-centered 'Vande Mataram Week' from 1–15 January 2026. In 599 Shakhas, a total of 4,839 Swayamsevaks regularly practiced the Vande Mataram song. 287 Swayamsevaks memorised the complete song. In 403 Shakhas, Bauddhik or discussion programmes on the subject Vande Mataram were conducted, and in 80 Shakhas, writing it was also practiced.

**Haryana** - On the occasion of the 350th martyrdom year of 'Hind Ki Chadar' Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, 'Shaheedi Smaran Saptah' was observed from 4–11 November 2025 to take this subject to more Swayamsevaks and to the new generation. In 633 Shakhas, this subject was presented in the form of Badi Kahani among 7,296 Swayamsevaks. Some Shakhas also presented this subject in 308 educational institutions of their Shakha Kshetra before 1,04,803 students, staff members, and others. Among the total 266 Karyakartas who presented the subject, 24 were Sikh Bandhus.

**Punjab** : In Jalandhar, the Mahavidyalayin Chhatra Karya Team organised the 'Anubhuti' programme on 25 January 2026 at Shri Guru Ravidas Maharaj Gurudwara Sahib, Santokhpura, on the occasion of Shri Guru Ravidas Maharaj Ji Prakash Varsh. The programme was organised by 'Bhagat Singh Vivekananda Vichar Manch' with the co-operation of Schedule Caste Ekta Empowerment Forum and Maharshi Kapil Muni Shakti Mahapeeth. The objective of this event was to strengthen Seva, Sadbhav, and cordial contact within the society.

**Punjab** - On 25 November 2025, a grand seminar dedicated to the 350th martyrdom year of Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji was organised in Bathinda through the organisation 'Jan Chetna', in the presence of Mananiya Sarkaryavah Ji. Sant Baba Jasbir Singh Ji, Ansh Vansh, Mai Desan, and Mukhya Sewadar, Patshahi Dasvin, were present as the distinguished guest. The

chief guest was Dr. Harmohinder Singh Bedi Ji, Chancellor of Central University of Himachal Pradesh. A total of 1,067 people were present, including 651 Sikh Bandhus, 60 women, and 356 other citizens. This seminar was an effort to reawaken the values of the unique sacrifice of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, Bharatiya cultural, unity, and religious freedom.

**Himachal** - on the occasion of 350th martyrdom year of Shri Guru Teg Bahadur ji programs were held in 363 Shakhas. 6 conferences were held in 5 districts. 2,450 elites participated. Mananiya Sah Sarkaryavah Dr. Krishna Gopal Ji addressed the conference held at Central University.

**Uttarakhand** - To spread the subject of Panch Parivartan should reach everywhere in the Prant, conferences and training sessions for representatives of the Three-tier Panchayat were organised in all 11 districts by the Karyakartas of Jagaran Shreni. In two sessions, discussions were held on Panch Parivartan, internal safety, and small self-employment initiatives, and future work plans were decided. Resolutions were taken to make villages plastic-free, and to promote water conservation and plantation. A work plan was prepared to ensure that all these initiatives continue regularly in the future. 947 Gram Pradhans, 621 Kshetra Panchayat Members, 135 Zila Panchayat Members, and 673 other members participated. Altogether, 2,376 representatives took part.

**Meerut** - On 20 February 2026, the 'Khiladi Samvad Karyakram' was organised in Meerut by the Paschim Uttar Pradesh Kshetra, in the presence of Pujaniya Sarsanghchhalak Ji. A list of 1,453 players and coaches from Braj and Meerut Prant was jointly prepared by the Krida Shreni of the Sampark Vibhag and the Karyakartas of

Krida Bharati, and invitations were sent. 963 were present, including 812 players and 151 coaches. Among them, 80 players had received international awards. Pujaniya Sarsanghchhalak Ji answered 14 types of questions asked by players. Prominently, international cricketer Bhuvneshwar Kumar, Olympian Javelin Throw athlete Annu Rani, along with many national and international level players, were present.

**Braj** - On the occasion of 100 years of Sangh Yatra and the 350th Balidan Diwas of Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, a dialogue programme with Sikh Bandhus was organised in Bareilly on 13 December 2025, in the presence of Sah-Sarkaryavah Dr. Krishnagopal Ji. A list of 400 prominent Sikh Bandhus from Pilibhit and Bareilly districts was prepared, and Granthies from ten Gurudwaras of both districts were invited. An exhibition related to the sacrifice of the Guru Putras, the sacrifice of Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, and Sangh Shatabdi Varsh was organised. 250 Bandhus were present. After the address, a question-answer session was conducted.

**Kashi** - Programmes of singing Vande Mataram in chorus and conferences on the topic were held in November and December throughout the Prant. Women also participated in good numbers. In Sultanpur the program was held at Pant sports stadium. Shri Brijesh Mishra IPS was present as chief guest and Dr Rajiv Upadhyay attended as special invitee. The program was presided over by senior journalist Shri Rajesh Khanna. 5,673 students from 17 schools participated. Two programs were held in Prayagraj. 6,050 were present. 400 hostel students of Kashi Hindu University participated in the chorus singing of Vande Mataram.



## Akhil Bharatiya Baithaks

**Prant Pracharak Baithak** - The Prant Pracharak Baithak was held on 4, 5, and 6, July 2025, at the newly constructed Keshav Kunj, Jhandewalan campus in Delhi. The meeting reviewed the reports of Sangh Shiksha Varg and discussed Karyakarta development, expansion of work, training, the outline of upcoming programs for the centenary year, organisational tours and other plans.

**Samanvay Baithak** - The Akhil Bharatiya Samanvay Baithak took place in Jodhpur on September 5, 6, and 7, 2025. Members of National level teams of various Sangh-inspired social organizations attended the meeting. The notable programs of various organizations over the past year, Panch Parivartan, discussions on the situation in various sensitive areas of the country, etc., and future direction and coordination were deliberated upon.

**Akhil Bharatiya Karyakari Mandal Baithak** - This baithak was held in Jabalpur (Mahakaushal Prant) on October 30-31 and November 1, 2025. The Vijayadashmi Utsavs, organized at the beginning of the Sangh centenary year, were reviewed, upcoming programs, work expansion, travel etc. were discussed. On this occasion the following three statements were released by Mananiya Sarkaryavah:

- 1) on the 150th Birth Anniversary of Dharti Aaba Bhagwan Birsa Munda,
- 2) to celebrate the 150th Year of National Song Vande Mataram, and
- 3) to respectfully remember the 350th anniversary of the supreme sacrifice of the 9th Guru of Sikh tradition Shri Guru Teg Bahadur ji.



## Present National Scenario

### Special Mention : Vishwa Sangh Shivar

In this centenary year, the Vishwa Sangh Shivar was also held with the efforts of Sangh Swayamsevaks living abroad. It was held from December 25th to 28th, 2025, in the vast Kanha Shantivanam campus in Bhagyanagar (Telangana). A total of 1611 Swayamsevaks and their families (1026 men, 585 women) from 71 countries attended the shivar. "Dharme Sarvam Pratishtitam" was the theme of the camp. Pujya Sant Govind Dev Giri Ji delivered a speech at the inaugural function on December 25th. Various sessions included discussions on the organisation of Hindu society in countries outside Bharat, the promotion and enlightenment of Hindu thought and culture, the adherence to family values, work among youth, and bouddhik sessions on topics such as the Sangh's journey, Dharma in sant and folk literature. At the closing ceremony, held on December 28th, Pujaneeya Sarsanghchhalak Ji delivered the main speech. Pujya Shri Daaji Patel, Shri Ramchandra Mission's chief, addressed the gathering, and Dr. Krishna Ella, Chairman of Bharat Biotech, the manufacturer of the coronavirus vaccine, spoke as the chief guest. Delegates felt that the enthusiasm of all, the joy of meeting each other, and the sense of mutual affinity despite living in a distant country made the camp unforgettable. Visiting the motherland during the Sangh's centenary year brought them immense joy and inspiration.

After reviewing our work over the past year, let's take a look at the current national landscape.

Recently, various examples of Hindu awakening and religious devotion have emerged in many places across the country. This year, several local events held in other parts of the country indicate one dimension of this awakening.

The grand Mahamagh Mahotsav, a festival of holy baths and Neel Aarti, was held for 15 days during the last Paush-Magh month at Tanuvaaya, on the banks of the Bharatapuzha River in the Malappuram district of Keralam. This Mahotsav, which was restarted three years ago after a gap of 250 years, took the form of a massive spiritual and religious event. This festival, rooted in ancient traditions, drew a daily influx of lakhs of devotees. This event also set a good example by taking environmental precautions. With the participation of organisations like Sewa Bharati and Hindu Aikya Vedi of Keralam, all the events were conducted in an organised manner. It created a widespread impact and an atmosphere of enthusiasm in Keralam society.

The Tamilnadu state government, citing communal tensions, had banned the age-old tradition of lighting the Kartigai Deepam on an ancient stone pillar on a hill in Tirupparankundram, in southern Tamil Nadu. This sparked public outrage. Massive agitation broke out. The matter was moved to the high court. The High Court ruled in favor of the devotees, stating that "the religious practices of society cannot be suppressed under the guise of political or communal reasons," and the lighting of the Deepam was permitted. This incident in Tamil Nadu awakened unity and self-confidence within the Hindu community.

The janjati communities of the northeastern state of Tripura pride themselves on identifying themselves

with the Sanatan tradition. Due to the prolonged insurgency and leftist influence in the state for approximately 30-35 years, there was an undeclared ban on the Sanatan rituals and festivals. However, the Sanatan cultural spirit never vanished from the heart of the community. A clear example of this was seen during the Jagannath Yatra. The Karbuk development block, adjacent to the Chittagong mountain range, is tribal-dominated. Last Janmashtami, an unprecedented Rath Yatra event was held there. Rath Yatras were organised at eight locations. Around 8,000 people from among a total population of 25,000 in the villages. The enthusiastic celebration of the festival by such a large number of people reflects the growing influence of Hindu culture in society.

Similarly, the number of young devotees visiting many temples across the country on the occasion of the beginning of the New Year or on other occasions has been increasing in recent years.

On the 150th anniversary of the national song Vande Mataram, the public demonstrated their spirit of patriotism through a good number of attractive programs of rendering this immortal song.

On the 350th martyrdom anniversary of the ninth Guru of the Sikh tradition, Shri Tegh Bahadur Ji, numerous inspiring events were held to pay tribute to the Guru. It is noteworthy that large events were organised in Nagpur, Nanded, and Kharghar, Navi Mumbai, to commemorate the Guru's martyrdom, with large numbers of people participating. These events were attended by the Pujya Baba Harnam Singh of Damdami Tanksal, Sardar Baba Kulwant Singh of Huzur Sahib Nanded, Hon. Home Minister of Bharat, Shri Amit Shah, Union Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari, Punjab Chief Minister Shri Bhagwant Singh Mann, Maharashtra Chief Minister

Shri Devendra Fadnavis, Baba Ramdevji, and numerous dignitaries and saints from the Banjara and Labana communities. People came from approximately 20,000 villages.

Undoubtedly, all these programmes have generated a wave of patriotism and cultural awakening among the large number of participants.

While on one hand this kind of national consciousness, cultural awakening, religious faith, and devotion to almighty are increasing, on the other hand, the many challenges facing society are also increasing people's concerns. In major Samajik Sadbhav meetings and during the dialogues with prominent citizens held this year, dignitaries while they welcomed the national renaissance in the light of Hindutva, they raised several issues and discussed some of the problems. These included religious conversions taking place in various parts of the country, demographic imbalance, insecurity of women, and the menace of drug addiction among youth. Furthermore, issues such as how to balance new technologies, including artificial intelligence, and modern lifestyles with Hindu values, the control and operation of temples by devotees rather than the government, the full and prompt implementation of the new education policy, and the preservation and promotion of Bharatiya languages were also raised. This certainly is a sign of social awakening. It is essential not only to ask or worry about issues, but also to be proactive in addressing them.

Many a time the social unity and harmony are disturbed on some pretext or an incident forcing personal emotions at play. It harms the society in the long run. That's why it is essential and prudence that we remain committed to social unity and oneness.

### **In the country and the neighborhood :**

Meanwhile, some desirable developments have also occurred within the country and its neighborhood. The government has achieved considerable success in controlling, almost eliminating, the extremely violent Maoist and Naxalite forces that had been a major problem for many years. Efforts have also begun to ensure social peace, public development, and a safe life in areas affected by this problem, which is welcome.

In the state of Manipur, unfortunately, in the last two years, the bitterness and animosity between two communities escalated into violence, becoming a challenge and having its political consequences. With some improvement in the situation, a new government has now been formed under new leadership. We hope that normal life will soon

return there, and all sections of society will experience unity through mutual harmony, and the state will develop through joint efforts of all. The Sangh always wishes for this and continues to strive in this direction.

In our neighboring country, Bangladesh, amid social and political unrest and instability, recently a grave and violent attacks on the Hindu community occurred. Hindus suffered widespread loss of life and property. Elections have recently been held there, and a new government is in the saddle of power. We urge the new rulers to rectify the inhuman injustices perpetrated against Hindu citizens, create the necessary conditions for them to live a life of peace, security, and dignity, and ensure the protection of their human rights.

In our other neighboring country, Nepal, a new government has recently been elected after social and political turmoil. We wish that peace and stability are established there and the country progresses on the path of development. Peace and stability in both these countries, and their harmonious relations with Bharat, are essential for the development and security of the entire region.

### **Towards Victory**

As mentioned earlier, national consciousness, the awakening of Hindutva, and social sensitivity are growing in society. As a result, a large number of good people are demonstrating their active participation in various positive social activities.

More and more people are showing eagerness to join the Sangh's work. They expect that Sangh must contribute to all socially good activities and to solve problems. We know well that as the eagerness and power of the good people increases, (Utsuk Shakti and Sajjan Shakti), it is crucial for the growth of the Nityasiddha shakti (Sangh's strength) to increase even more. Given the appreciation and support received from society, it is incumbent on us to plan to accelerate and enhance the Sangh's work. We should outline the follow-up work for the coming year by making proper use of the support and contacts received by the Sangh during its centenary year. In this regard, the coming times are both an opportunity and a challenge for us. To fulfill our rashtra dharma (national duty) and meet society's expectations, we will move forward in this work by strengthening Swayamsevakatva, Sangh culture, and its texture, and we hope to achieve complete victory in our endeavour.


